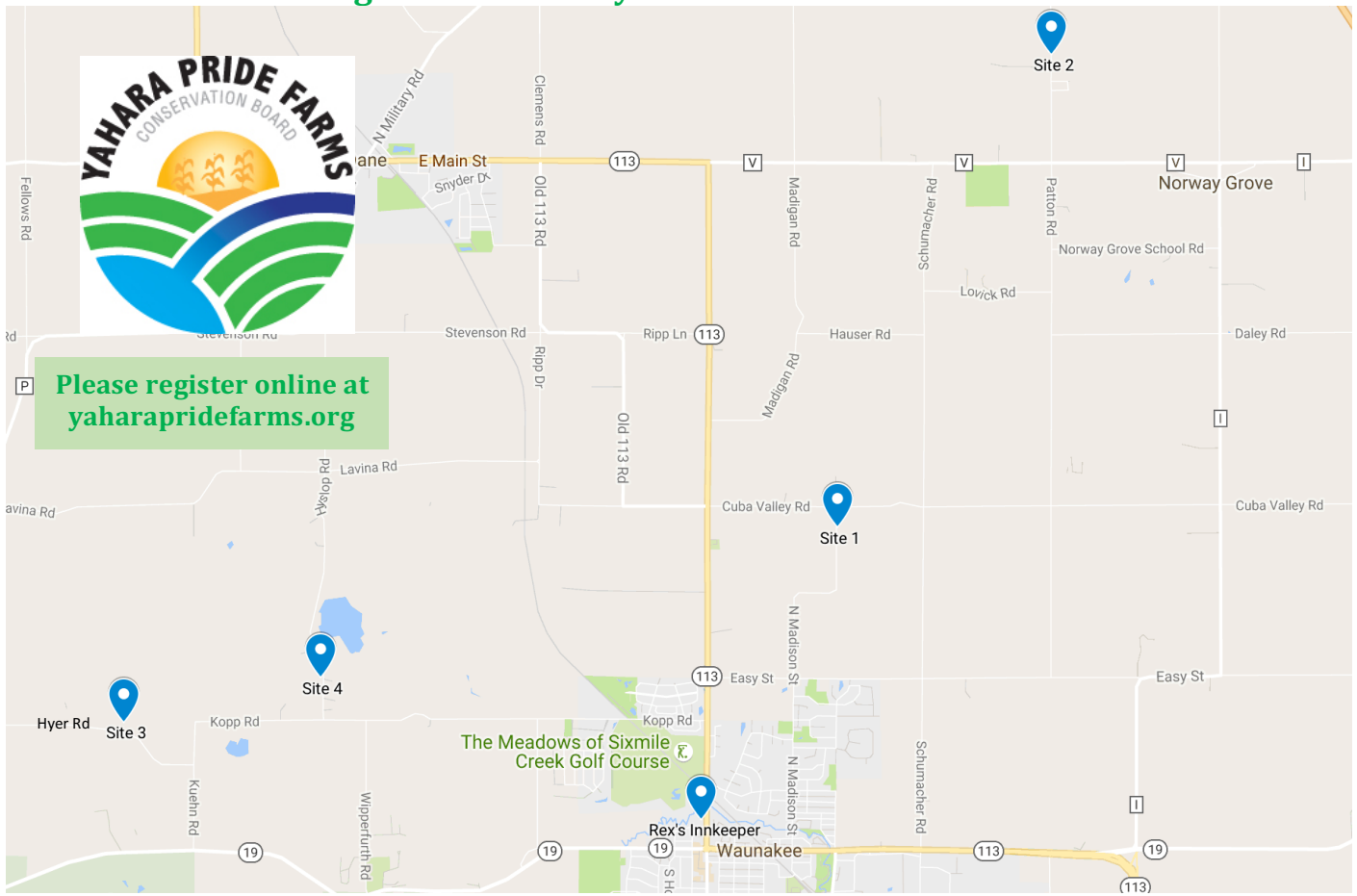


Ag Innovation Day Schedule and Locations

Overview of the Program

The purpose of Yahara Pride Farm's Ag Innovation field day program is to showcase innovations in sustainable agriculture in the Yahara Watershed. Featured techniques are applicable to farms across the state with similar conservation goals. Yahara Pride Farms has engaged the community, public utilities, environmental groups and agribusiness through a holistic approach to conservation where everyone shares in the successes and areas for learning. Yahara Pride Farms is a proud partner in the Yahara WINS program that brings together all sources of phosphorus in the watershed (agriculture, sewerage and industry) using Watershed Adaptive Management. In 2015, farmers in the program reduced phosphorus delivery to Madison lakes by 8,642 lbs!

Farmers from across the state are encouraged to attend this event. There will also be a specific track for members of the community and media who wish to learn more about sustainable agriculture in Dane County and the Yahara Watershed.
